10 ways to get your home in shape for spring

When poet T.S. Eliot wrote, "April is the cruelest month," he could have had northern New England in mind. Yearning for sunny days and glorious blooms, we often get mud and rain instead. Still, a number of chores can be done now to help almost any home welcome better weather.

- 1. Chop up any remaining patches of ice or snow with a shovel so they'll melt faster. Otherwise, they can smother grass and promote fungus.
- 2. Clear up dead leaves and debris. Consider tackling litter by the roadside as well, if you have the energy. Your neighbors will thank you!
- **3. Walk around the house and look for winter damage.** Storms and freeze-thaw cycles can dislodge flashing, tear off shingle tabs, and pop out nails in wood siding and trim. If there's damage you can't handle yourself, hire a pro now before they get booked up. A Sabattus Regional CU equity line of credit can be a great "go-to" for home projects. See us for info.
- **4. If you have a gravel driveway, rake the gravel out of your lawn.** It's much easier to take care of this now than after the grass starts to grow.
- **5. Prune summer-flowering shrubs now, before the buds swell.** Wait to prune spring bloomers like forsythia or lilac until after they flower.
- **6. Prune back overgrown evergreens and hedges.** Now's the time to do it, before they sprout new growth.
- 7. Check for leaks in the attic. If you discover a small water stain, there's time to fix the roof before the leak gets bad enough to seep downstairs.
- 8. Replace batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors, unless you changed them when Daylight Savings Time started on March 12.
- **9. If you're going away, don't count on good weather.** Many a spring break has featured a surprise snowstorm or cold snap. Ask a neighbor to keep an eye on your house in case of a power outage or heavy snow.
- **10. Tune up the lawn mower.** Replace worn blades and belts, and fill the tank. Winter may struggle to hang on, but it will have to give up sooner or later—and before you know it, spring will be bustin' out all over.

Financial Fitness Fairs

During the 2015-16 school year, a total of 6,904 students from more than 115 high schools in Maine participated in a Financial Fitness Fair: A Money Management Experience. More than 35 Financial Fitness Fairs were hosted last school year, and to



date, they have been attended by more than 38,000 students across the state of Maine. At these fairs, Credit Union staff and volunteers help students complete a budget after facing real-world financial decisions, ranging from the kind car they will drive, the student loan they will need, and the type of cellphone plan they can afford. For many, it's their first time talking about saving, spending, budgeting and credit scores.
